


# **St. Lawrence Catholic Church and School**



## **Discipleship Award Program 2018—2019**

**Level: Sixth Grade  
Part: B**

**Due: Monday, Feb. 18, 2019**

Dear Parents,

The purpose of the Discipleship Award Program is to help the young people of St. Lawrence learn, explore, and experience our Catholic faith in a way that leads them to a greater understanding of and a deep, lifelong commitment to our faith. It is important for our children to learn that we are not passive spectators in our relationship with God. Each and every day, we must engage ourselves in activities that draw us closer to God and to our final goal of eternity with him in Heaven. It is the goal of this program to give our children opportunities to do just this, engage in activities that draw them closer to God, and to recognize them for their efforts. The Discipleship Award Program is an optional program for those students and families who wish to use it.

There is an award booklet for each grade level, Kindergarten through 8th Grade. Each grade level booklet will contain age appropriate activities. It will be important however, especially with younger children, for parents to be actively involved in assisting children with completing the program requirements. In fact, some of the activities included are family activities. The Church teaches that “Parents are the principal and first educators of their children” (CCC 1653), and children will receive the most benefit from this program if families are actively involved in the learning process.

How the program works:

- Each year, students will have the opportunity to achieve the discipleship award three times (see due dates to turn in paperwork on the following pages). If a student earns all three awards in a given year, he/she will receive special recognition in the form of an additional award, called the Trinity Award. Students who achieve the Trinity Award for 3 or more consecutive years are invited to an annual dinner in their honor.
- The activities within the program are separated into four categories based on the Four Pillars of the Catholic Church: 1) What We Believe; 2) How We Worship; 3) How We Live; and 4) How We Pray. Some activities within each category will be required, and some of the activities will be listed as options within each category.
- The due dates and directions for each of the award periods are given on the following pages.
- Homeschoolers: When instructions are given to share something with a class, the student can share the project at a homeschooling or similar type gathering.

**Section One: What We Believe**

***REQUIRED ACTIVITY***

We believe that God fulfilled his covenant with his people by sending his Son, Jesus, as our Savior. Many of the Old Testament prophets foretold Jesus’ Incarnation. Read the Old Testament passages listed below. On a separate sheet of paper, list the passages and, in your own words, write a sentence or two explaining how each describes the promised Messiah. Attach the sheet to this form.

***CHOOSE ONE OF THE FOLLOWING ACTIVITIES***

\_\_\_\_\_ Option #1: On a separate sheet of paper, write a reflection or poem using what you discovered by reading the Scripture passages listed above. Describe in your reflection or poem how the Israelites must have felt about God’s promise to send a Savior. Ask your teacher for permission to share your reflection or poem with your class. After sharing your reflection or poem, have your teacher sign here. \_\_\_\_\_ Attach your reflection or poem to this form.

\_\_\_\_\_ Option #2: We believe that the saints are examples of holiness for us. Research one of the following saints: St. Bonaventure, St. Cecelia, or St. Martin of Tours. You may use your religion book, saint books, and the internet to help you with your research. (Two useful saint websites are: <http://saints.sqpn.com/alphabetical-list/> and <http://www.catholic.org/saints/>) Create a PowerPoint presentation or video that teaches about the saint you researched. Make sure to include a picture of the saint, a short biography, interesting facts, feast day, patronage, and any other interesting information you learn. You may also include music. You should also include a slide with your name listed as the presentation creator and a slide citing any sources you used including the music. You can turn in your presentation by either burning it onto a CD or emailing it to Mrs. Roman: [mroman@stlawrence.org](mailto:mroman@stlawrence.org).

**Section Two: How We Worship**

***REQUIRED ACTIVITY***

As Catholics, we believe that “the Sunday celebration of the Lord’s Day and his Eucharist is at the heart of the Church’s life” (CCC 2177). It is important that we gather as a Church family each Sunday and on Holy Days to worship. When you attend Mass on Sunday or a Holy Day, USE THE “*I attended Mass today*” STAMP AT ONE OF THE CHURCH EXITS TO STAMP THE APPROPRIATE DATE on at least 14 of the following weekends/Holy Days. Don’t forget to say hello to the priest or deacon after Mass. (If you attend Mass at another church you can have the priest or deacon sign or attach a copy of the church’s bulletin.)

\_\_\_\_\_ Option #1: Serve as a greeter at a Sunday Mass. You should arrive 15 minutes prior to Mass to greet people and open the church doors for them as they arrive for Mass. ## Section Three: How We Live

We believe that the Ten Commandments, given to Moses and passed down to us, are the laws of God’s covenant with his people. God’s laws help us to show our love for God, others, and ourselves.

### CHOOSE TWO OF THE FOLLOWING ACTIVITIES

\_\_\_\_\_ Option #1: The First Commandment, “I am the Lord, your God: you shall not have strange gods before me”, calls for us to believe in God and to put him first in our lives. Our society often sends the message that there are many things more important than God. Think about some of the things that are “idols” in the world today. These are things people treat as more important than God. Find images of these things and make a collage of these images on a sheet of construction paper. On the back of the collage, write a short prayer asking God to help us to always put him first. Turn in your collage/prayer when you turn in this form.

\_\_\_\_\_ Option #2: The Second Commandment, “You shall not take the name of the Lord, your God, in vain”, calls for us to always show deep respect and reverence for God’s name. We should never use the name of God in disrespectful or unnecessary ways, such as “OMG”. Make a creative “campaign” poster that calls on teens to always show respect for God’s holy name and to not use it unnecessarily. Use words, symbols and pictures that will capture the attention of people your age. Turn in your poster when you turn in this form.

\_\_\_\_\_ Option #3: With your parent’s permission, organize a mini-food drive in your neighborhood. Collect food items from at least 6 neighbors (or relatives) to be donated to the Matthew 25 Food Drive on one of the following weekends: Nov. 17/18, Dec. 15/16, or Jan. 12/13. After donating the food, write and deliver short thank-you notes to all who donated explaining that their donations will be used to feed the hungry in our community. When you have completed this, have your parent sign here. \_\_\_\_\_

\_\_\_\_\_ Option #4: Select one or more ornaments from the Giving Tree that is in the church (beginning in November). Use your own money to purchase the item(s) to donate. (You can offer to do extra chores for your parents or grandparents if you need to earn the money.) Write the name of the item(s) and the date you placed it/them under the giving tree.

\_\_\_\_\_ Option #5: With your family, volunteer at the Thanksgiving Dinner for the needy on Thanksgiving Day, November 23rd in Higgins Hall. Hours for volunteers are 10:00 AM to 1:30 PM. \_\_\_\_\_ Option #3: On January 6th, lead your family in praying the Blessing of the Home and Household on Epiphany. \_\_\_\_\_ Option #5: On February 2, we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. On January 24, read Luke 2:22-40 with your family and begin the Novena for the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. Print the Novena prayer from the parish website; there will be a link on the homepage. Pray the prayer together for nine days. Choose a different family member to lead the prayer each day. On the back of the Novena prayer sheet, make a list of which family member led the prayer each day. Attach the list to this form.

\_\_\_\_\_ Option #6: With your family, attend Mass on Sunday, February 3 and have your throat blessed after Mass in honor of the Feast of St. Blaise. Use the “*I completed this activity*” stamp at the back of the church to stamp here:
